On 7 Nov. 2006, SI South West Pacific President Mrs Lorna Mead presented the Overall International Best Practice Award to SICB at the Petrolium Club, Kuala Lumpur.

SICB won the SI Good Practice Award for the Economic & Social Development Sector and nabbed the Overall SI Good Practice Award in the process – the first time for Malaysia and the first time for SI South West Pacific.

The project that SICB presented was its goat rearing project for the Orang Asli community at Kg Cempuruh, Janda Baik, Pahang. Funding of Yen 500,000 came from SI Kyoto Toka, who donated the money in celebration of its 15th anniversary.

Such an honour called for celebration which SICB did in conjunction with its 13th anniversary. A celebratory dinner was held at Tea for Two on 7 Nov. and our guests were Mrs Lorna Mead and Margaret Mitchell (SISWP Hon. Secretary), SIROM President and SI Singapore President as well as our sisters from other SI Clubs

SIROM initiated the idea of implementing projects on prevention of violence against women and children to celebrate 15 years of Soroptlmism in Malaysia. Through SIROM's efforts, funds were raised from Yayasan Nanyang Foundation (Nanyang Press Foundation).

Why does SI Bangsar focus on personal safety programme for children with emphasis on preventive measures from sexual abuse?

Child sexual abuse is the exploitation of a minor for the sexual gratification of an adult or any significantly older person. It is called incest when it occurs between family members.

Studies in Malaysia showed that 80% of rape victims knew the offenders. Child sexual abuse happens in all racial, religious and ethnic groups and at all social-economic levels.

In 2002, reported sexual offences, including rapes, totaled 2903 cases against 1932 in 1995. An estimated 50 – 60 % of these cases involved minors. However, many went unreported due to family and social reasons/taboos.

The minute we have the green light from SIROM, it was full steam ahead. Our committee, comprising Sim Chan, Yeo Pei Li, Lam Swee Theam and Sehu Chai Kee, held meetings in the evenings to plan and prepare the manuals for 3 age groups: 3-6, 7-9 and 10-12. Research was undertaken, materials and training were tracked down from various sources. Our idea was to make it as interactive as possible and to create awareness through fun activities.

We are most grateful to have a great co-partner, SK Taman SEA, whose Principal, Mr Lim and his senior assistant, Puan Theah, gave us strong support to run the pilot with their students and made available the staff, premises and facilities.

The pilot workshop catered for the age group of 10 - 12. The 55 multi racial participants were mainly 12 years old.

The pilot was run on a bright Sat 9 Sept 2006 from 9 am – 4.30 pm.

We welcomed the support from our SIROM President who encouraged other SI sisters to attend. She turned up bright and early and together with 9 sisters from SI Ampang, Bangsar, Petaling Jaya, Johor Baru, Damansara and teachers as observers, our facilitators conducted the programme in an interactive and fun mode.

Feedback was obtained from participants and observers. Encouraging and complimentary responses were received. Not only did the students enjoy the fun filled educational activities but we, facilitators, also received a positive high. We have already received invitation to run such workshop for next year from a parent of a participant in the school she teaches!

We hope to continue running the workshop as well as training facilitators so that the message can reach far and wide. Plans are also afoot to translate the manual into the Malay language for rural schools.

The Legal Literacy workshop, conducted by two SICB members, Sehu Chai Kee and Rohayah Ahmad, was held at Pusat e-Komuniti Lembah Pantai, Bangsar on 7 Sept. 2006. The objective behind SICB's Legal Literacy programme is to impart knowledge on legal and practical issues in purchasing a residential property and how to go about financing it. Thanks to our sponsor, Deutsche Bank Asia Foundation, this is knowledge that women should know in owning an asset and protecting their rights.

Peck Lin, the project coordinator, arranged the workshop as part of a soft skills and motivational training for eHomemakers, whose membership comprises ladies who work from homes. The group of 25 ladies that morning came from different backgrounds - single parents, jobless, part-time workers and also a few disabled. Chai Kee and I were deeply touched seeing some of these ladies entering the room in wheelchairs and crutches just to widen their knowledge on property ownership.



Chai Kee started off in the area on property ownership, the critical issues to consider and the pitfalls to look out for. There was so much to impart and so limited time! The participants were responsive and Chai Kee had quite a time explaining and answering their queries. After a short break, Rohayah began her enlightening session on the housing loan process which ended at 1 pm. It was encouraging to share our knowledge and to respond to their concerns.

All in all, the workshop was a success. Participants confided that they knew very little about property ownership and housing loan process. The knowledge that we shared that day was valuable and practical and some of them wished that they had more time to talk to us. We were emotionally touched seeing the disabled making an effort to attend and participated actively in the questions and answers session. We bid farewell, feeling light headed that another programme to share some legal knowledge with our women friends in eHomemakers had gone on well.
