

SURIA BANGSAR SOUTH: ACTIVITIES FROM JANUARY – MAY 2014

Suria Bangsar South successfully conducted several activities from January to May 2014.

1. Tuition classes

The tuition classes started on 4th March 2014 on every Tuesday till Friday of the month. The Bahasa Melayu and Science classes were conducted by Julizawati bt Mat Jusoh and the Mathematics classes by Noor Ilyana bt Ismail.

2. Music class for Children

The music classes are conducted on either the first or third Saturday of every month at 10 am till 12 noon. The classes were well attended by 34 children. The classes were facilitated by SICB member Lay Hong and she was assisted by her sister Dr Lok Lay Keng and students from Malaysia Institute of Arts (MIA), Department of Music. So far three lessons were conducted on 8th March, 19th April and 17th May. The children learnt to sing traditional and modern songs. MIA students gave demonstration of the different musical instruments to develop their aesthetic value. The children will be performing at Suria Bangsar South Majlis Hari Raya on 23 August, 2014.

3. Creativity Class for Children

The creativity class for children are conducted alternates with the music class on either the first or third Saturday of every month at 10 am till 12 noon. Like the music class, the creativity classes were well attended by 34 children. The classes were conducted by SICB members, Banu, Sim, Datin Indira, Swee Theam and Ella. So far, two classes

were conducted on 22nd March and 3rd May. One class was on games and another on creative art – painting. Other planned activities include workshop on personal safety, career choice, craft and cooking. There will be a display of the children’s art work at the Majlis Hari Raya Puasa on 23rd August 2014.

The fun learning of English gave the ladies some confidence to conversing in English. It is proposed that the ladies be awarded with a certificate at the end of the year.

Some ladies brought their own laptop and netbooks belonging to their own children. Despite the setback, there were great enthusiasm and participation from the ladies. The ladies will participate in a competition to design an event programme for the Majlis Hari Raya in August. They would also produce their own promotion e-flyer and that would be made into a competition for them. It is proposed that the ladies be awarded with a certificate at the end of the year.
